# Moving & Storage Institute Congratulates 2014 Scholarship Winners

The Moving & Storage Institute (MSI) has once again awarded \$15,000 in scholarships to 10 extraordinary students for the 2014–2015 academic year. The top award of \$5,000 was funded with a generous donation from the National Association of Independent Truckers (NAIT), while AMSA member donations to the David Brodsky, Russell Schofield and MSI Scholarship Program funded one \$2,000 scholarship and eight \$1,000 scholarships.

Since its inception, the MSI Scholarship Program has awarded more than \$185,000 to employees, children and families of AMSA member companies, advancing the educational objectives of dozens of young people throughout the country. Scholarships are meant to provide partial tuition and assistance to deserving students who are pursuing a course of study that may have an impact on the household goods moving and storage industry.

This year's candidates were chosen based on a wide range of criteria, including academic achievement, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, work experience, goals and aspirations, and an outside recommendation. The program is administered by Scholarship Management Services, the nation's largest nonprofit, private-sector scholarship and educational support organization; the governing board of the MSI makes the final award decisions.
